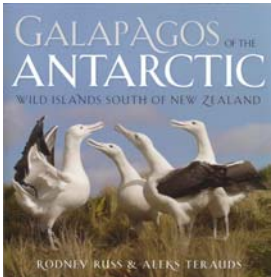

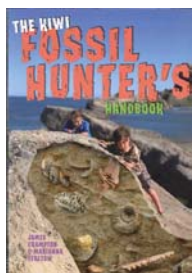

New Zealand has a rich fossil record which is accessible to the amateur fossil-hunter in locations around New Zealand, including shells and plant remains as well as the bones, teeth and other remnants of ancient reptiles, birds and fish.

This handy pack-sized guide features 30 accessible locations around the country where kids and their families can find fossils. Each location contains specific information on where to look and what to look for, as well as the geological background and other details of each site, and colour images of fossils that could be found there.

What the sites look like now is supplemented by colourful mini-posters showing reconstructions of New Zealand in the past by well-known artist Dave Gunson. The book has been to coincide with the opening of the 'Dead Precious' touring exhibition at Te Papa, which will run until the Easter school holidays.

Domestic Violence: Intersectionality and Culturally Competent Practice

Lettie Lockhart & Fran Danis

Experts working with twelve unique groups of domestic abuse survivors provide the latest research on their populations and use a case study approach to demonstrate culturally sensitive intervention strategies.

Chapters address African Americans, Native Americans, Latinas, Asian and Pacific Island communities, persons with disabilities, immigrants, refugees, women in later life, LGBT survivors, and military couples, as well as domestic violence in rural environments and among teens, and the role of religion.

This textbook opens with an overview of intersectionality, culturally competent practice, and domestic violence and basic practice strategies, such as universal screening, risk assessment, and safety planning. Subsequent chapters are written by collaborative teams of research and practice experts and cover the latest research on specific populations.

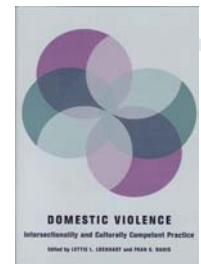
Illustrative case studies demonstrate generalist social work practice, including how to develop respectful collaborative working relationships aimed at defining issues from the survivor's perspective; collecting and assessing data that focuses on the strengths of individuals, families, communities, and service delivery systems; goal setting and contracting; identifying culturally specific interventions; implementing culturally appropriate courses of action that intervene at appropriate system levels; participating in community level strategies; and advocating for improved policies and adequate funding at (American) local, state, and federal levels.

As a study guide or for use in general practice, *Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynaecology 3rd edition* is easy to read, simple and straightforward.

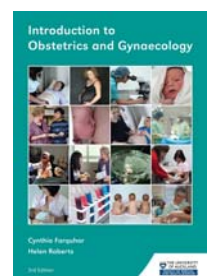

This provides an inside view, mapping the elements of the campaign step by step and enables an understanding of how a successful campaign is built.

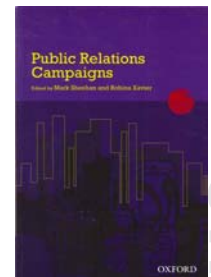
There is also a focus on campaign analysis, comparing and contrasting competing interests and an exploration of campaign impact.

Nonproliferation Norms: Why States Choose Nuclear Restraint

Maria Rost Rublee

What can be learned from countries that opted out of the arms race. Too often, our focus on the relative handful of countries with nuclear weapons keeps us from asking an important question: Why do so many more states not have such weapons? More important, what can we learn from these examples of nuclear restraint?

Maria Rost Rublee argues that in addition to understanding a state's security environment, we must appreciate the social forces that influence how states conceptualise the value of nuclear weapons. Much of what Rublee says also applies to other weapons of mass destruction, as well as national security decision making in general.

The nuclear nonproliferation movement has created an international social environment that exerts a variety of normative pressures on how state elites and policymakers think about nuclear weapons. Within a social psychology framework, Rublee examines decision making about nuclear weapons in five case studies: Japan, Egypt, Libya, Sweden, and Germany.

In each case, Rublee considers the extent to which nuclear forbearance resulted from persuasion (genuine transformation of preferences), social conformity (the desire to maximise social benefits and/or minimise social costs, without a change in underlying preferences), or identification (the desire or habit of following the actions of an important other).

The book offers bold policy prescriptions based on a sharpened knowledge of the many ways we transmit and process nonproliferation norms. The social mechanisms that encourage nonproliferation - and the regime that created them - must be preserved and strengthened, Rublee argues, for without them states that have exercised nuclear restraint may rethink their choices.

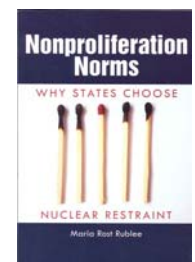

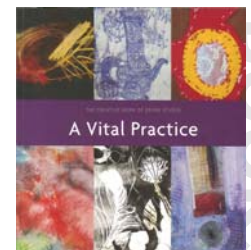
The projects provide an innovative and unique blend of visual arts learning and creative expression; integrating art making methodologies with person centred self development processes.

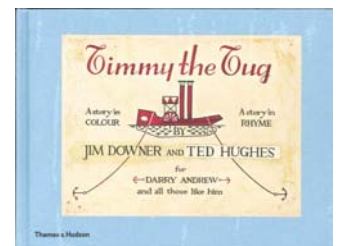
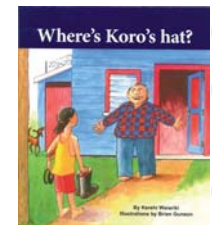
Jim Downer & Ted Hughes

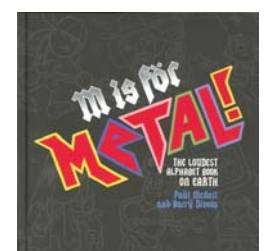
Imagine Dr. Seuss crossed with Spinal Tap and The Simpsons and you're in the ballpark.
